Taking place Saturday, Aug. 30, through Monday, Sept. 1, this annual festival turns Fountain Square into a lively celebration of all things Irish — with music, dancing, food, contests and family fun.

Whether you come for the bagpipes or the beer, Irish Days offers a blend of small-town Americana and Celtic spirit.

Festival hours are 10:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 30; 10 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 31; and 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday, Sept. 1, in and around Fountain Square, 145 Old McHenry Road, Grove. Parking and admission are free.

Honoring a native son

The Waukegan Park District will host the 25th annual Ray Bradbury's Dandelion Wine Arts & Music Festival from noon to 6 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 16, at Bowen Park, 1800 N. Sheridan Road, Waukegan.

The free, family-friendly festival celebrates Ray Bradbury with arts and music. Art vendors, including painters, sculptors and photographers, will have their art for sale.

During the festival, the Arts Park Program will give attendees the opportunity to create art, the Haines House Museum at Bowen Park will be open for free self-guided tours, community organizations will provide free goodies and local resources, and Nightshade and Dark's Pandemonium Brewery will be selling Ray Bradbury-themed beers, cocktails, and wines.

Ray Bradbury, born in Waukegan on Aug. 22, 1920, was an author and screenwriter in fantasy, science fiction, horror and mystery.

Some of his most famous works, like "Dandelion Wine," include references to his hometown memories of Waukegan. Bradbury passed away on June 5, 2012, and is honored in numerous ways in Waukegan.
